Happy New Year to everyone! I am incorporating mindfulness techniques in my group sessions with students, and even in some form during classroom guidance lessons for the spring semester. To keep things simple, I am introducing the mindfulness topic in all Pre-K through 4th grade classrooms. The students will engage in three basic mindfulness activities.

1. **MINDFUL MOMENT:** We will practice keeping our bodies still and quiet while we listen to silence. The activity will begin with a chime sound and students will be challenged to listen to the chime as long as they can hear it, and then stay quiet for a while longer to listen to any sounds in the room. The students will share what they heard after the activity, and discuss if staying still and quiet was hard for any of them.
2. **DEEP BREATHING:** We will practice inhaling and exhaling for five counts each. Arms will extend outward while inhaling and relax inward upon exhaling.
3. **RELAXATION:** Students will listen to relaxing music while listening to a guided imagery exercise.

I am hopeful that this therapeutic technique of focusing one's awareness on the present moment, while calmly acknowledging and accepting one's feelings, thoughts and bodily sensations will enhance and add to our student's educational experiences here at Milam.

1st Grade

Happy New Year 2018! We are at the beginning of the third period of this school year! All our students are working so hard to get ready for 2nd grade. During this month, the first graders will continue learning about Non Fiction Literature but they will also start learning about Fables. In Writing we are working on "How to" books. In Math we start working with Measurement, using nonstandard units. In Science we continue observing the moon and we will start learning about different types of Soil and Rocks. 2nd Grade

Hey Second Grade! What will the new year bring? Reading more challenging books, solving more challenging math problems, and experimenting and exploring in Science and Social Studies. We hope everyone has had a restful break and we are looking forward to an awesome Spring semester!

3rd Grade

Welcome back from a relaxing and restful Winter Break! We are working on fiction in reading and personal narratives in writing. In math we are solving multiplication, division, and graphing problems. In social studies we are discussing how citizens change a community. In science we are working on landforms. Remember to continue great reading habits and practicing multiplication facts.

4th Grade

Fourth grade is off to a busy year. In Language Arts, we are learning about important people through reading biographies and autobiographies. The students are writing essays about important ideas they have. In math, we are continuing to work on multiplication and division. Science is focusing on renewable and nonrenewable resources. Reading daily will help your children to be successful in both reading and math. Please encourage them to spend at least 20 minutes a day with a good book!
